National Park withdraws subsidy for 128**

East Yorkshire Motor Services will run their Sunday 128 Scarborough to Helmsley bus service from April. The National Park have withdrawn their subsidy for this service, so it needs lots of passengers in 2014 if it is to continue. EYMS are also hoping to run a Sunday tourist service for walking and days out between **Pickering – Kirkbymoorside – Castleton – Danby** from May. Developments at the Methodist Church

Kirkbymoorside's Methodist Church premises are an important resource for the local community, used regularly or occasionally by a wide variety of groups, organisations and individuals. Over the past year, plans have been drawn up and approved for the improvement and modernisation of these premises and we are now in a position to begin work after Easter. The plans include a new entrance with portico at the front of the building, leading into a coffee lounge and corridor; improved toilet, kitchen and storage facilities; a new ramp and disabled access and energy saving measures, such as lowering the ceiling, double glazing and the installation of solar panels. All regular users of the premises have been or will be contacted and it is hoped that the work will go ahead without disruption to any users. We intend to have an Open Day once the development is complete and we look forward to welcoming and sharing our new premises with everyone!

Kirkbymoorside Town Council

The Town Council joined the team at Church House in June 2012 and the Town Clerk is based there every Wednesday to answer your queries about council matters and assist with library duties.

Our agreement with the County Council means you can access Town Council services at Church House whenever the library is open (see below for opening hours).

We hope you will use the library as a one stop shop for County and Town Council matters.

Moorside Room

The transformation of the old library building into a modern space for community use is almost complete. The work has been carried out by local builders, Buffoni Hemmingfield. The old steps and porch have been removed and the floor lowered to ground level making the building fully accessible. There is a store room, toilet facilities and a small kitchen area for making drinks. Care has been taken to preserve original features where possible and the fan-shaped window with surrounding carving is now above the interior door. The room is available for hire for events such as meetings, exhibitions or private parties. Opening of the Moorside Room and Made in Kirkby Exhibition

The formal opening of the Moorside Room will take place at 2.30 pm on Saturday 3 May. Everyone is invited to come and see the improvements to the building and enjoy the exhibition as we celebrate the variety of things that are Made in Kirkby.

Dog Fouling

This is one of the main anti social complaints identified by people in the town. To encourage dog owners to pick up after their dogs the Town Council has placed bins at key points around the town and free bags are available from the library. The Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 1996 applies in all areas in Kirkbymoorside within the 40 mph limit and also to Manor Vale Wood. The Council has contacted the Dog Warden at Ryedale District Council and our CPSO for help with the issue.

Welcome to Kirkbymoorside signs

The Council recently agreed to purchase four additional marketing panels to place beneath these signs. These may be hired at a cost of £45 per month by groups and businesses wishing to promote their events. There will be an option to hire the panels at a reduced rate for subsequent months depending on demand.

Town Meeting

The annual Town Meeting will be held at 7 pm on Wednesday 7 May in the Moorside Room. The Mayor will give her annual report and the Community Award will be presented to someone who has given outstanding service to the community. The meeting is an opportunity for people to raise any concerns they have about town matters and also for local groups to pass on information about their activities during the past year.

Gladman update

The third planning application for residential development the west of the town by Gladman developments Ltd, was considered at a special meeting of the Planning Committee of Ryedale District Council on February 4. The application was refused but Gladman are expected to appeal. Meanwhile the Judicial Review by Mr. Shaw and Mr. Hewitt has been stayed pending the result of the appeal.

Tesco Store

Mark Thomas, Tesco's Regional Corporate Affairs Manager North Tesco has told the Town Council that the company is planning to build the new store in time for opening in 2015/16. We expect Mr Thomas to come to a Town Council meeting later in the year to provide us with more information.
