

The changing face of Rotary



Although polio has not been seen in this country for many years, it is vital that Rotary continue its efforts to eliminate the disease worldwide in order that it can never return. Rotary clubs in Great Britain & Ireland have so far donated over £20 million to End Polio Now. The eradication of polio when completed will be one of the most significant achievements in public health since the end of smallpox.

Helmsley & District Rotary has happily met in Helmsley and Kirkbymoorside since it was formed in 2005. It even had a spell in Wombleton. Now meetings take place in the library at Kirkbymoorside on Monday evenings and things are changing.

At last the 'throw-away society' seems to be crumbling and people are ready to do something about wastefulness. Often the first question is 'What can I do to make a difference?' When an item is broken, or a piece of clothing is torn or worn, the first instinct has been to throw it out and buy a new one. The idea of Repair Cafés originated in Amsterdam. The first one in Kirkbymoorside was in September 2017, and volunteers mended, or offered advice on, a variety of articles including: skirt, hedge-clippers, LED lamp, shirt, lamp, ghetto-blaster, trowel, trousers, watch strap, dress, 2 radios, 2 laptops, handbag, electric drill, cassette player, speaker, and portable charger.

Since then there have been three more Repair Cafés. The Café element is provided by home-made refreshments for those waiting their turn, or who just want to relax and chat.

The next Repair Café will be held at the Moorside Room on Saturday May 12th 2018 from 9.30 - 12.30. Bring along your broken or damaged items and the volunteers will see what they can do.

Community Award
